Re: Millennium Challenge Compact – Roads Sector Reform Activity

Dear Honorable Minister Konneh:

The purpose of this Implementation Letter is to set forth understandings regarding the implementation of the Roads Sector Reform Activity under the Millennium Challenge Compact signed on October 2, 2015 (the “*Compact*”), between the United States of America, acting through the Millennium Challenge Corporation (“*MCC*”), and the Government of the Republic of Liberia, acting through the Ministry of Finance and Development Planning (the “*Government*”). Each capitalized term used but not defined in this letter has the meaning given to such term in the Compact.

Section B(2)(a)(ii) of Annex I of the Compact describes the Roads Sector Reform Activity. After discussions among the Government, MCC, and the United States Department of Transportation, John A. Volpe National Transportation Systems Center (“*Volpe*”), the Government has indicated that it wishes to implement this activity by engaging Volpe. More specifically, the Government has indicated that it wishes to make available to Volpe up to \$5,000,000 of Compact funds, to be drawn from the Roads Sector Reform Activity budget. It is proposed that these funds will be made available to Volpe by means of an interagency agreement between MCC and Volpe. This Implementation Letter will be followed by a subsequent Implementation Letter that will further describe the relationship between the Government and Volpe.

If you agree with the description of the arrangements with respect to Volpe that are described in this letter, please sign below and return a copy to me by fax or electronic mail. This Implementation Letter will be effective upon the date of the later signature by the Government.
