US\$15M To Boost Critical Road Maintenance If...

Liberia stands to benefit more from the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) as the 257 Million MCC compact project is well on course. Through an incentive-matching fund, the MCC will match government contribution on a one to one basis up to US\$15 million during the compact for national road maintenance activities.

Speaking to the press on Tuesday at the Millennium Challenge Account Office in Monrovia, the head of delegation Mr. Jonathan Nash indicated that as long as Liberia continues to observe good governance, economic freedom and investments in her citizens, the Country would continue to benefit from the MCC.

A High-Level Delegation of the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) visited Liberia to highlight progress on project implementation under the compact signed October 2015 between the Government of Liberia and the United States of America.

According to report, the high-level delegation led by MCC Chief Operating Officer, Jonathan Nash met senior government officials to discuss continue support for compact project implementation, among other things.

The US\$257 Million MCC compact with Liberia was designed to increase economic growth, reduce poverty

and improve the lives of Liberians by increasing access to reliable and affordable electricity, and strengthening the electricity sector, as well as improving planning and the implementation of the road maintenance", Mr. Nash said.

He said progress under the compact has already been made at the Mt. Coffee Hydropower plant, in which MCC provided USD\$ 147 million, the single largest donor to the rehabilitation. He said additional projects focus on ensuring electricity reaches homes and businesses.

He further reported that MCC provides for the construction of the state of the art training center; the construction and equipment for a new Liberia Electricity Corporation (LEC) customer service center to improve service delivery; and the establishment of the Liberia Electricity Regulatory Commission (LERC).

Mr. Jonathan Nash said the compact will also contribute US\$15M to match Government of Liberia's funding for critical
